### Financial Plan and Budget

- BACWA's 5 Year Financial Plan and FY Budget Updated each year.
- Process
  - Review Plan and Budget with Finance Committee of the Board (Feb)
  - Draft Plan and Budget to BACWA Board (Feb)
  - Final Plan and Budget to BACWA Board (Mar)
  - Approval of 5 Year Plan Update and FY Budget (Apr)

#### BACWA Revenues

- Dues funds on-going operations (i.e. administration, committee activities, collaborations, legal, communications, staffing)
- Clean Bay Collaborative (CBC) funds regulatory initiatives (i.e. TMDLs, watershed permits, special studies, etc.)
- Nutrient Surcharge temporary charge to supplement the CBC due to the large annual expense of the Nutrient Watershed Permit
- Wastewater Opertaro Training (WOT) passthrough, BACWA provides contract administration

# BACWA Funding Outlook

- ▶ FY 17
  - Dues increased 2% over FY 16
  - Clean Bay Collaborative fees remained flat
  - Nutrient Surcharge increased from \$600k in FY 16 to \$800k
    - ▶ 2/3 funding by Principals
    - ▶ 1/3 funding by Associates/Affiliates based on TN
- ► FY 18
  - Draft budget in March, proposed dues and CBC similar to FY 17
  - Nutrient Surcharge projected to remain flat at \$800k,

## Organizational Outlook

- For FY 17 all 46 POTWs in 9 County Bay Area are BACWA members
- AIR committee transitioned from subscriber based funding to a regular BACWA committee funded by member dues
- BACWA members active in representing POTW interests in several regional and state-wide initiatives and issues
- 9 active Committees with succession plans in place

#### Summary

- BACWA continues to count all of the Bay Area POTWs as it members
- Remains in a sound financial position
- With the transition of BAPPG and AIR to regular BACWA committees over the last few years, participation in all 9 committees is open and encouraged for all BACWA members
- Continues to budget for funding of regulatory requirements on behalf of all of its members
- As negotiations get underway on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Nutrient Watershed Permit, BACWA will keep its members in formed of regulatory options and financial impacts
