Potable Reuse: Reservoir Water Augmentation Regulation


- Regulation allows advanced treated recycled water to be stored in reservoirs providing drinking water supply
- Review reservoir retention time for Bay Area Agencies late 2016
- Proposed regulations released July 21, 2017
 - BACWA Comment letter, 9/12/17: Requested regulatory language to allow surface water reservoirs not meeting 60-day theoretical hydraulic retention time to utilize an <u>alternative clause</u> that would meet water quality requirements
- Revised regulation released December 1, 2017

Incorporated Expert Panel recommendations

No changes in 60-day theoretical hydraulic retention time requiremenst

AB 574 (Quirk) to Define Potable Reuse

Future Potable Reuse Regulation

- AB 574 requires regulations for raw water augmentation in 5 years (by December 31, 2023)
- Committee will continue monitoring progress of Potable Reuse regulations

Recycled Water Project Funding Opportunities

- \$10M available from Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Act
 - 30-day application period
 - Applicants included several Bay Area Agencies
 - BACWA provided support letters for Bay Area agencies seeking funding for recycled projects

Recycled Water Project Funding Opportunities

Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF)

- 2017/2018 Intended Use Plan
 - Limited number of projects will receive SRF funding (Group 1 and 2)
 - Funding unavailable for several Bay Area Agencies in (Group 3, applications under review)
- CWRSF Policy & Prioritization Workshop
 - BACWA provided comments recommending policy revisions and prioritization recommendations
 - Equitable geographic distribution of funds
 - Fund construction cost incurred prior to issuance of funding agreement
 - Prioritize multi-benefit projects and ready to proceed projects

Recycled Water Project Funding Opportunities

CWRSF Policy Revisions

- State Water Board increased leveraging authority
- Allow partial funding of projects
- Potentially allow reimbursement for construction costs incurred prior to funding agreement

Committee plans

- Monitor availability of funding for recycled water projects
- Provide support for Bay Area project applicants

Recycled Water Policy Amendments

Drivers

- Salt and Nutrient Management Plans
- Adjust priority pollutant monitoring
- Review and update existing recycled water permits
- Requirements for reporting and tracking recycled water production and use
- Update CEC monitoring requirements
- Re-evaluate State recycled water goals and mandates

Recycled Water Policy Amendments

Salt and Nutrient Management Plans (SNMP)

- Prioritize basins instead of requiring SNMP for every basin in the state
- Provide framework for Regional Water Boards to allocate resources for permitting recycled water projects
- Adjust priority pollutant monitoring
 - Remove priority pollutant monitoring requirements for landscape irrigation
 - Reduce number of constituents to be monitored
- Review and update existing recycled water permits
 - Recycled Water General Order 2016 requires enrollment of 96-011 permittees by June 2019
 - Provide Regional Water Boards framework for transition

Recycled Water Policy Amendments

Recycled Water Use, Potential Volume

- Data used for nutrient management permit, potential funding availability
- Labor intensive, may be inaccurate
- Duplicate reporting requirements between Climate Change Resolution, Urban Water Management Planning, Recycled Water Policy
- BACWA provided comment on Climate Change Resolution to minimize duplication of efforts and greater inter-agency coordination
- Draft of Revised Recycled Water Policy available March/April 2018
- Subcommittee: Work with Regional Water Board, develop process to bring 96-011 permitees under the General Order
- Committee representative: Participate in revisions to the Recycled Water Policy

Building Standards, Recycled Water Systems

- AB 2282 Research and develop mandatory recycled water building standards
 - To require recycled water systems on new residential, commercial and public buildings
- Committee representative on Advisory Committee
 - Withdrew requirement for indoor use of recycled water
 - Exemptions allowed to landscape irrigation requirements
 - Cost effectiveness, supply availability, supply reliability

Water Use Efficiency and Recycled Water

- Implementation of Executive Order B-37-16
 - Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life
- Standards for indoor and outdoor efficiency
- Issues with disincentives to recycled water projects
 - Includes recycled water in outdoor water budget calculation
 - Proposed prohibition to use recycled water on turfs on streetscapes
 - Additional regulations that already exists in other recycled water regulations
- Committee plans to monitor and participate in rulemaking processes
