San Francisco Public Utilities Commission

- Moved events online
- Focused on social media
- Digital articles
- Pretreatment Inspections
 - ► All field activities on hold until May
 - New IUs inspected
 - Permit renewals not getting inspections
 - Priority pollutant influent and effluent sampling
 - ► On hold through May

Services of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission

West County Wastewater Covid-19 Update

- All employees who can work from home are doing so for the foreseeable future.
- Minimum staffing at the District Office and at the Plant
- District Board has approved Administrative leave for employees who are asked to stay home and do not have the ability to work from home.
- Masks are to be worn inside all District buildings at all times and when working within six feet from another employee.
- All meetings with more than three people need to be conducted virtually.
- All capital projects that were put on hold have slowly started to resume over the past two weeks
- No non-WCW employees allowed inside District buildings

West County Wastewater Environmental Programs Division Update

- No inspections, sample events, tours or outreach events since March 17th.
- Staff has been working on SOPs, code revisions, data management remotely.
- Staying up to date on safety trainings and webinars. CWEA and NACWA offering remote trainings.
- Adding more P2 content to the WCW website and facebook page. We're now on Nextdoor!
- Some pretreatment activities to resume in June
- Thinking about remote classroom presentations for the 20/21 school year

Regional Water Quality Control Plant

Public Outreach

- Virtual events
- In-classroom school program converted to free virtual lesson plans (cleanbay.org)
- Digital ads and utility bill inserts don't rush to flush campaign

Pretreatment

- Inspections on hold, will resume in June
- Permit issuance/renewals continued as needed
- Billing Sampling of trunklines continued as normal
- Monitoring operational status of regulated companies and significant industrial users (essential businesses)





Admin

- No non-SVCW employees or contractors allowed inside facility
- Admin pay provided for employees who stayed home during SIP without the ability to work from home (returned June 1)
- All employees provided VPN to sign onto Teams
- Ops, Maintenance and Lab moved to skeleton crew in order to limit contact through May 31
- All employees who can work from home are doing so for the foreseeable future
- Use of Microsoft Teams and Sharepoint for meetings, file sharing, and communication
- All capital projects were assessed and some continued while others were put on hold
- Pandemic Emergency Response Plan was developed with details of who has responsibility for what and who will be onsite at what times
- Consolidated Pandemic Schedule spreadsheet on Teams of who is onsite week by week



Physical Space/Wellness:

- Symptom and temperature check protocols put into place for worker return
- Vehicles assigned to specific employees. If shared users must use a disinfection protocol before and after use
- Masks are required when working within six feet from other employees
- Operations control room is being moved to a larger space to enable social distancing
- Lunch room microwaves moved to enable social distancing
- Directional arrows put on floors for movement flow to avoid contact with others

Environmental Compliance

- Field sampling continued and completed
- Stormwater Inspections put on hold until late May, resumed no contact inspections week of May 18
- Resuming social distance inspections week of June 8
