










Sewer Types Serving Different Purposes



In 2004, IEUA entered into a
Mutual Aid Agreement with their
Regional Contracting Agencies and
other partners to provide
emergency response in the event
of a disruption which would affect
the water service, sewer service,
or sewage treatment services
provided by each agency.

IEUA has taken the lead in organizing quarterly meetings between the Mutual Aid partners for sewer collection training, discussions on regional system issues, and regulatory updates.

- 2022 Sewer Collections Team hosted the first ever Multi-Agency Sanitary Sewer Overflow Drill.
- Total of six Agencies/Cities
- Training consisted of multiple SSO simulations and bypass support.













- The Mutual Aid Program has now incorporated this Regional Sanitary Sewer Spill Simulation training as an annual all-day event.
- This allows members of the agreement the opportunity to provide their staff emergency response training.
 - Supports the WDR Sanitary Sewer
 System General Order
- This provides the region with first-time responders who have the hands-on experience necessary to manage all occurrences.

How does a Mutual Aid Partnership help you?

- Is Mutual Aid support in the WDR?
 - —It's not explicitly called out in WDR
 - —However, it can support compliance for SERP, WDR Attachment D-6.
- Can it help with the Sewer System Management Plan?
 - Bolstering backup equipment and inventory (Att D4.4)
 - —Will support these areas
 - Specifications 5.2 (procedures),5.6 (Resilience), 5.7 (Resources), 5.12 (SERP), and 5.19 (Proper Operations of any Facility).

AMENDMENT UPDATE TO MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT AMENDMENT UPDATE is by and between Inland Empire Utilities Agency, the Regional Contracting Agencies consisting of Cities of Chino, Chino Hills, Fontana, Agency, the regional Confacting Agencies consisting of Cities of Chino, Chino (1108, Formatia, Montelair, Ontario, Upland, Cucamonga Valley Water District, and Jurupa Community Services

Whereas, Inland Empire Utilities Agency, the Regional Contracting Agencies, and Jurupa Whereas, imand campue outdies agency, the regional contracting agencies, and output Community Services District (JCSD) are public agencies and each has certain equipment and

Whereas, the equipment and personnel may be available to assist each agency and JCSD in the event of a disruption which would affect the water service, sewer service or sewage treatment service provided by each agency and JCSD to its customers; and

Whereas, no party should be placed in a position of depleting unreasonably its own resources, facilities, or services in providing such mutual aid; and

Whereas, Inland Empire Utilities Agency, the Regional Contracting Agencies, and JCSD desire to cooperate in providing and sharing available equipment upon request of the other party

NOW, THEREFORE, the undersigned parties hereto agree as follows:

- a. In the event of any disruption or damage to the ability of either the Inland Empire Utilities Agency, the Regional Contracting Agencies, or JCSD to continue to serve the public or its customers with water service, sewage service or sewage treatment service, the other parties, will cooperate to a maximum extent possible, as determined in its discretion, to provide
- b. Each party's obligation hereunder shall be expressly contingent upon its manpower and equipment availability, as determined by the responding party in its sole and absolute equipment avalationity, as determined by the responding party in its sole and absolute discretion. Each party's response within the jurisdictional limits of the other party may not described cases pany a response within the junisdictional name of the other pany may not interfere "the responding party's responsibility or ability to respond to emergencies or other calls within its own jurisdictional area. Each party shall endeavor to notify the other party in advance when it knows that its equipment or manpower will not be available to respond
- 2. In the context of this Agreement, "natural or man-made disaster" shall mean a situation or set of circumstances in which property damage or personal injury has occurred or is likely to occur, or circumsonics in which property outlings or personal injury has been recorded by the Inland Empire Utilities
